At this remarkable event, diners will be treated to an amazing culinary experience while admiring the sweeping views of Magnetic Island and Castle Hill.

"How it came about is we were seeing the need to really promote our region," Mr Merrin said.

"It's about putting Townsville on the map and showcasing what we have available in our region."

As well as being a night out for the tastebuds, Mr Merrin said he hoped the event would stray from other black tie events on offer as it would incorporate a unique mix of local performing art talent from the synergy of Dancenorth performers to the collaboration of some of the best chefs of the region's restaurants and proudly feature the best of our locally grown produce.

"We've got a diverse food bowl up here, as we call it, with everything from amazing local seafood to the like of the Tablelands procuring cheese; there's some cattle grazed up in the Gulf, it's a whole array of food," he said.

As well as providing a launching platform for what Mr Merrin hopes will grow into an annual festival in the future, the Townsville BMW Taste The North dinner will really be a showcase event promoting the best in North Queensland food to locals and visitors alike.

The idea is that for every table purchased, between two and four of those seats will be for guests invited from overseas, interstate or out of the region to give them a night out experiencing the best Townsville has to offer.
